

# **Excavation to Begin Soon**



With demolition almost complete, our site is nearly ready for the next phase: excavation.

As demolition of all the buildings that will be replaced by the Center for Community Health winds down, we look forward to initiating the first phase of construction: excavation.

To expedite completion of demolition on schedule, we anticipate that work hours will be expanded for the remainder of August:

Monday through Friday: 7:00 a.m. to 5:30 p.m. and Saturday: 9:00 a.m. to 5:00 p.m. If these work hours change, we will notify you under separate cover.

We do not anticipate extended or weekend work hours during the month of September.

The construction schedule for the next four weeks follows:

## August 15th—August 19th

Demolition of Fifth Street buildings continues.

#### August 22<sup>nd</sup>—August 26<sup>th</sup>

- Demolition of Fifth Street buildings I continues.
- Installation of construction phase site fence will begin.

#### August 29th—September 2

- Demolition of Fifth Street buildings to be completed.
- Installation of construction phase site fence continues.
- Soil testing in preparation for excavation begins.

#### September 6<sup>th</sup>—September 9<sup>th</sup>

(No work will take place on Labor Day, September 5<sup>th</sup>.)

- Installation of construction phase site fence to be completed.
- Soil testing in preparation for excavation continues.
- Sixth Street sidewalk and partial street closure to be implemented. DOT signage will be installed.

### September 12<sup>th</sup>\_September 16<sup>th</sup>

- Soil Testing in preparation for excavation continues.
- Support for excavation installation begins
