Course Objectives At the conclusion of the course, participants will: 1) Understand the latest advances in the field of colorectal surgery. 2) Acquire basic skills in laparoscopic suturing, soft tissue dissection, intestinal resection and anastomosis. 3) Gain exposure to the limitations of current technology in laparoscopic intestinal surgery. 4) Learn how experts handle complex clinical problems in the field of laparoscopic colorectal surgery.
