Have You or Someone You Know Experienced a Stroke?

Individuals who have experienced a stroke resulting in foot-drop are invited to participate in a study aimed at improving walking, safety, function, and quality of life. The Ness L300™ is a functional electrical stimulation unit that provides an electrical stimulus to the muscles of your lower leg in order to help you lift your foot up during walking. The Ness L300™ system has clearance from the Food and Drug Administration (FDA) for use in stroke rehabilitation.

Adequate funds for transportation between the clinical site and your home will be provided to you for each study-related visit.

You may be **eligible to participate** if you:

- Have had a stroke more than 3 months ago
- Are 18 years old or over
- Meet the requirements for participation
